

he End Markets Committee meeting has been busy the past few months as guest speakers have brought a varied mix of useful information to our discussions. We

thank speakers such as Dr. Hongyan Ma, Associate Professor of Civil/Materials Engineering at Missouri University of Science & Technology, who spoke with our members about embodying Carbon in concrete and explained in detail the successes he has seen in recent pilot programs. James Gaspard from Biochar Now shared the latest updates and reviewed the firm's production process. Tom Miles, and Myles Gray, P.E. of the U.S. Biochar Institute promoted the sustainable use of Biochar and the importance of finding the right product for the right end market markets. Todd Byrum with Butler Paper shared information on some of the uncommon revenue-generating materials we see in our waste streams that recyclers might be overlooking. Charles Winum of Steinert US joined us to discuss the benefits of installing Eddy Current units into our MRFs. He offered Steinert's assistance in determining the appropriate eddy current for a facility's needs.

The variety of topics covered by this committee is impressive. However, it will take ideas from all of us to ensure that valuable topics and new end-market ideas continue to be explored. What new markets are you developing? Let us know, and your topic might be featured in a future meeting! Thanks to Co-Chair Lincoln Young for stepping up and agreeing to help lead the committee recently, and to all members for participating in our discussions.

Gypsum Recycling Committee Update

The Gypsum Recycling Committee's mission is to provide guidelines and other assistance in developing and expanding recovery and end markets for recovered gypsum. Over the years, companies

have perfected methods of processing the material into useful end products ranging from soil additives to new gypsum wallboard. Supporting these efforts while also significantly increasing the volume of post-consumer gypsum recovered and recycled is extremely important to our members, legislators, and the communities we serve. Many of our recent discussions have been with these concerns in mind.

The committee has developed key considerations for the National Stewardship Council (NSC) on behalf of its members, for potential inclusion in forthcoming legislation expected to be introduced in the next legislative session. The expected bill is aimed at mandating drywall recycling in California, a market estimated to represent approximately 3.6 million tons of material. It's important to note that recommendations are only made when we feel that our members' opinions on a topic are clear and reasonable sample sizes have been obtained through polling and by other means. In recent discussions,

it has been made clear to us that practical, sustainable approaches to drywall recycling that weigh existing environmental goals with current industry capacity and reasonable timelines are preferred.

Our gypsum drywall Life Cycle Analysis (LCA) development continues with help from Innovative Technical Solutions. Our vendor expects to be able to complete the first phase of the work very soon! Thanks to all of our member sponsors, who are helping us to complete the comparison of the various end-of-life management approaches for virgin and recovered gypsum and develop preliminary assumptions and impacts for gypsum and the drywall paper bound to it. In addition, the entire value chain is being evaluated and findings relating to the current EPA WARM waste reduction model are also being examined.

We encourage all member companies interested in gypsum drywall to consider sending a representative to committee meetings in the New Year, or perhaps even sooner! Make plans to join our next meeting by sending an e-mail to info@cdrecycling.org.




